Point of view – your perspective – affects every area of your life.


So, what do you see?

PERSPECTIVE, ON POINT

Webster's Dictionary defines Perspective as:

- A mental view or prospect
- A visible scene; vista
- The interrelation in which a subject or its parts are mentally viewed; point of view
- The capacity to view things in their true relations or relative importance

And being found in **human form** (perspective), he (Jesus) humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Philippians 2:8

CHAPTERS 31-40

Reasons to be thankful-

- Who did Ted thank for the food in Chapter 31? What perspective was he coming from there? Who was Ted in relation to who he prayed to?
- What was Jarl's perspective on "the difference a day can make" in Chapter 32? What contrasting emotions had he experienced during that one day?
- Who did Ted say looked after Jarl while he was trapped in the oubliette?

Seeking perspective -

- Jarl found himself in an emotionally new situation in Chapter 33. Who did he ask for help? Why?
- In Chapter 34, Tessa related a story about her Granny and potatoes. How did Tessa's and her Granny's perspectives differ?
- Have you embraced the big life God has for you? What is one thing you can take action on to discover His perspective for your life?

DISAPPOINTMENTS AND SNAGS

Jarl and Tessa found each other in Chapter 35, but couldn't be with each other at that time.

What was Jarl's perspective on this disappointment?

Did what Markus told Jarl and Tessa in Chapter 36 offer any hope?





EARTHLY VERSUS HEAVENLY PERSPECTIVE



People needed manna on earth in order to survive.

Jarl delivered that manna. We see two places in Chapter 37 where he did this. A Chinese underground worship service and a cottage in the Scottish Hebrides.

Imagine for a moment that you were in their place, running out of food – what would **your** perspective on delivery of the manna be?

Job 37:14-16


TIMING IS EVERYTHING

REAL-LIFE EXAMPLES OF PERSPECTIVE

John

The Apostle John was just hanging out, praying, one day when he had a visitor.

The resurrected Jesus stopped in, eyes blazing like fire, glowing like burnished bronze. John dropped like a dead man.

Jesus revived him and then, later, took him to heaven to show him many things that would occur in the future. He wrote them down for us to read.

Earthly perspective dramatically altered by heavenly perspective!

You can read his story in Revelation Chapters 1, 4

Elisha and his servant

It looked like Elisha was in a deadly, tough spot.

Elisha's servant got up early and went out of the house, only to see an army with horses encircling the city. He ran back in, scared to death, to tell Elisha.

Elisha said, in a nutshell, "No worries!" then prayed for the servant's eyes to be opened. *Bing* The Lord opened the servant's spiritual eyes and he saw that the mountain was full of horses and chariots of FIRE! Man's army was no match for God's army.

Earthly perspective dramatically altered by heavenly perspective!

You can read this story in 2 Kings 6:8-23

HOW DO YOU GET GOD'S PERSPECTIVE?

(IT DOESN'T HAVE TO BE HARD...)



Jesus said in Matthew 7:7 -

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you."



Jarl knew this in Chapter 40 -

Jarl knew he was *in* Jesus and Jesus' Spirit was *in* him. He knew he had the "mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:16) and could access his perspective.




LISTEN!
