

## **Perspective Note Taking Sheet**

Whether through physical eyes or the eyes of the heart, who doesn't want to \*see\* (understand, observe, comprehend) clearly?

So, what do you see?

What was Jarl's perspective on this disappointment?

Did what Markus told Jarl and Tessa in Chapter 36 offer any hope?

People needed manna on earth in order to survive.

Jarl delivered that manna. We see two places in Chapter 37 where he did this. A Chinese underground worship service and a cottage in the Scottish Hebrides.

Imagine for a moment that you were in their place, running out of food – what would your perspective on delivery of the manna be?
