A fortunate circumstance

Compassionate treatment of those in distress

The rebellion of Satan and all who joined him culminates in Chapter 79. Being on the wrong side of that battle leads to death.


Repentance is to turn from rebellion and sin to Jesus; to change one's mind.

"The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance."


2 Peter 3:9

REAL-LIFE EXAMPLES OF MERCY

Esther

Esther went from being a nobody to becoming Queen of an empire. But she had a secret.

The King didn't know about her Jewish background. And when an evil man tried to wipe out all the Jews, Esther had to make a difficult choice. Would she approach the King even though she hadn't been summoned and risk death in order to save her people?

She did, and she received mercy for herself and all the Jews!

Peter

When Jesus was taken into custody before his crucifixion, Peter tried to stay loyal and followed him. But, he ended up denying Jesus 3 times.

Peter was heartbroken by his actions. He ran out and wept because he had denied his Lord. He remained sad and afraid.

Until... Jesus extended mercy to him, forgave him and reinstated him.
